We provide a safe and caring environment for our kids to learn. NCES is a Title I school with a Free and Reduced lunch population of 80%. We have a growing Hispanic and Migrant populations are rapidly growing. Our staff is comprised of a mix of local residents and residents of other counties. Several teachers prefer to work at our school instead of working in their county of residence.

We have met our past goals for NCLB and were identified by the Ky Association of School Councils as a school progressing to proficiency. This year, our 4th grade science scores reached 100. Under the new testing K-PREP system, we scored in the 26th percentile and are identified as a needs improvement school along with 69% of the elementary schools in the state. We are ranked 545 out of 733 elementary schools.

Data analysis raises the following questions. Which areas are our strengths? Which areas are weak? How can we get the most student improvement with available funds? The data shows a rough correlation between 'all males' and 'free/reduced lunch' gap group. The correlation is very close within third, fourth, and fifth grades reading and math. Sixth grade correlation is present, however, not as prevalent. Overall, we have too many students scoring Apprentice and Novice in Reading. Our math scores dropped, but this may be due to the large curriculum gaps between Kentucky Core Content 4.1 and the new Kentucky Academic Core Standards. The data released to date does not tell us which specific area/strand/component/concept is weak or strong. Teachers do not know which area needs more emphasis.

Areas of Strengths

What were the areas of strength you noted? What actions are you implementing to sustain the areas of strength? What is there cause to celebrate?

Fourth grade Science is our biggest area of celebration. Student index reached 100. This is the first area in our district to reach 100. We will have a special event/reward for this group of students. Overall, third grade had the most students performing at proficient/distinguished levels.

Opportunities for Improvement

What were areas in need of improvement? What plans are you making to improve the areas of need?

We have several areas in need of improvement. Emphasizing all aspects of reading across all grade levels is a priority. This academic area impacts all other subjects. Math scores were lower and we are renewing emphasis on algebraic and problem solving skills. Teachers have analyzed data and KASC graphing of data. Since test results were released later than expected, we implemented general steps to close our predicted gaps. We increased intervention in K-2. We will continue intervention in grades K-6 and work to provide more assistance for students performing below grade level in reading and math. Our school also received an ESS daytime waiver to utilize retired teachers for intervention. We are working to create a schedule for an early morning math club. This will open the computer labs for students in grades 4, 5, and 6, which are performing below grade level in math, to work on concepts. This will also help in our efforts to move to Standards-Based teaching, learning and reporting.
