1776—The Continental Congress fled from Philadelphia to Lancaster and York, Pa., and then to Carlisle, Pa., where they met on Sept. 17, 1777, and signed the Declaration of Independence.

1787—The Constitution of the United States was signed in Philadelphia, Pa., on Sept. 17, 1787.

1800—The first census of the United States was taken in 1790, and the second in 1800, showing a population of 3,929,214.

1803—The Louisiana Purchase was completed, doubling the size of the United States.

1820—The Missouri Compromise was passed, admitting Missouri as a slave state and Maine as a free state.

1823—The Monroe Doctrine was announced, declaring that the Americas were closed to European colonialism.

1845—Texas was annexed to the United States, leading to the Mexican-American War.

1848—The California Gold Rush began, leading to a massive influx of settlers.

1850—The Compromise of 1850 was reached, settling the territorial dispute over California.

1854—The Kansas-Nebraska Act was passed, leading to the Kansas-Nebraska War.

1859—The discovery of gold in California led to the California Gold Rush.

1861—The American Civil War began with the firing on Fort Sumter.
