

Have You Been Counted?

The Census enumeration in this city and county have been completed since April 15, in gathering statistics of our population. The enumeration period in cities of over 50,000 population will end May 15. Enumerators seem to be doing their work in earnest and effort to have a complete and accurate census.

In this city findings of the occupants of a house place in the first visit are recorded. If the occupants are still absent, then the statistician, as far as possible, records the names and addresses of persons competent to give the information. In this way it may prevent persons from being overlooked. Likewise, although not personally seen in the enumerator's office, the names of all regular lodgers, etc. It is nevertheless possible for a person to be missed in this way, in order that a thorough, complete and accurate count may be made.

We will fill out the census schedule in the same manner as we do the census. We will investigate the population schedule, and see that the figures are correct. In making the census, it will not be necessary to fill out the census before you leave, as we will add your letter as indicated in the census, and will write to you again in the course of time.
