Be the first in your district to head the list for \$5.00, \$2.50 or \$1.00.

The amount asked from Nicholas county is small and should be raised with little difficulty. Do your duty and your district will raise its quota.

We want to say Nicholas County's quota was raised by volunteers. It is easy to give in a mass meeting, under the heat of excitement, or to an earnest solicitor, but it takes a real man to give voluntarily. This drive will close by TUESDAY, APRIL 15. In order to do that you are urged to be a prompt volunteer.

If it does not suit you to make a cash contribution you can sign a pledge card to be paid by August 15, 1919. Cards can be secured from N. Efron, John W. Tilton or W. F. Tune. If it is not convenient for you to see your school district collector mail check to John W. Tilton, Treasurer, mentioning the name of your school district so it will get credit for it.

Each school district will be given credit for the amount given, therefore the name of each contributor with the amount given will be published.
