A WORD OF WARNING The Ky. Agricultural Experiment Station in its Bulletin for the protection of the consumer and honest manufacturer, under the Ky. Feeding Stuffs Law, has the following to say of the system of tagging: "A Yellow Tag printed in Black Letters indicates that the feed contains a material of little or no feeding value, such as old hulls, clipped out by-product, cob meal, cotton seed hulls, peat, etc., the name of such materials being printed in Yellow Type. Such feeds are commonly known as Yellow Tag Feeds. "A Manila Tag printed in Red Letters indicates a feed made of products or by-products of two or more grains or cereals or plants, such as corn and wheat, or corn, wheat and oats, etc. Such feeds are usually known as Straight Mixed Feeds. "A Manila Tag printed in Black Letters indicates a feed made of one grain or plant only, such as wheat, barley, oats, cracked corn, cotton seed meal, etc. Such feeds are commonly known as Straight Feeds. Some of this cheap "Yellow Tag" feed which is now being used by some farmers is practically worthless as a milk producer. Do not let the low price persuade you to buy "Yellow Tag" feed.
