TOBACCO ==its prospects

The Tobacco Planters of The Burley Belt Have The Best Opportunity They Have Had For Years To Make Real Money Out Of The Growing Crop/Provided It Is Carefully Cared For And Properly Handled.

From present prospects, it is the shortest crop we have pitched for twenty years. We must see to it that when it is harvested it will be clean, bright and free from house-burn. There is undoubtedly today an over-supply of common, damaged tobacco in the world's markets and in the hands of the manufacturers. There has never been a time when there was an over-supply of fine or sound, well-cured tobacco. Therefore, the planter has a real opportunity this year to clean the atmosphere and to make money.

What are the requirements necessary to produce a good crop of tobacco, even if weather conditions are unfavorable? First: Good land and careful, frequent cultivation. Second: The sowing of all tobacco twice in order to get the weight and oil. If success are piled while they are small, two sownings will cost no more than one when the success get large and half the weight of the plant has gone into them. Third: Let the tobacco get ripe. Fourth: Careful and deliberate housing. No tobacco should ever be put into the barn wet, with dew on it, or in a hurry, because tobacco housed under favorable weather conditions soon molder, will house-burn, as the plant in the green state is full of water.

House-burn means the worst kind of damage, because it causes loss of weight, loss of color, loss of absorbent qualities and therefore an enormous loss in value. Fifth: Be prepared if wet weather comes to cure up the tobacco with artificial heat. This can be done with the little cost, intelligently applied, either with portable salamanders and coke or with stoves and pipes running through the barn. The man who succeeds most in this one who gets results under unfavorable conditions. All of us know men in our respective neighborhoods who produce a good crop every year. In 1921, when the worst house-burned crop in history was being marketed, Sanford Lyles, of Fayette county, sold over the Fayette floors his entire crop at an average price of \$46.00—cured by artificial heat and not a house-burned lot in it. Last year we observed on one farm a crop, cured with salamanders and coke, bring \$29.00 on the open market; another crowded in the barn and left to itself, bring barely \$12.00.

The Fayette Tobacco Warehouse Company has made arrangements to furnish salamanders at wholesale prices to all planters.

We believe undoubtedly that this year's short crop, properly cared for, will bring to the planters the best price we have known for several years.
