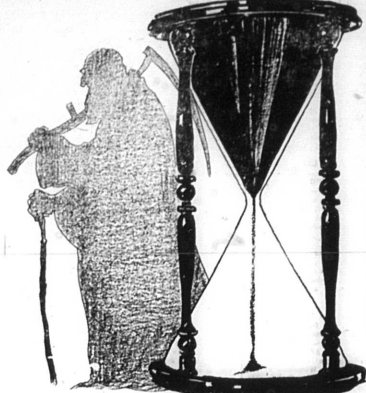

WHAT CAUSES APPENDICITIS?
