MAY START SEPT. 10

Frederick A. Wallis of Paris, last week was selected as Democratic campaign chairman after a caucus held here Saturday morning. Judge Rufus LaFollette, nominee for Governor, and the majority of the other delegates to the caucus were present. Wallis has accepted the chairmanship and will leave for the opening of the Democratic State Convention at Louisville Thursday. Judge LaFollette indicated at a meeting of the members at Louisville Thursday that Wallis may be the leader of the campaign. This will be decided upon later, when the members of the committee will meet at Paris on September 10. Mr. Wallis' appointment as state campaign director is viewed with interest here. He is the only Democrat registered at the hands of the Democratic party since John P.
