

Delayed Topping, Close Suckering, Best Practice

Experimentation made at the experimental station of the University of Kentucky indicates that, experimentally, both yield and quality, topping followed by close suckering, gives the most profitable results with haying tobacco. Topping was delayed until all the plants had blossomed and a few weeks had elapsed on the seed heads. Suckering was best closely practiced on harvest time.
