For the majority the root crops are omitted from the garden after a choice in the planting of the year's first crop. The roots, carrots, turnips and radishes, are the most valuable and most profitable crops that the home gardener can raise. At the same time, it should be noted that the root crops are the most difficult to raise and require the most care and attention.

Although a study book is ideal, a customer who must work with either heavy soil need not conclude that he cannot grow potatoes. The soil can be made to be rich in the first place, and the farmer can use the soil to his advantage by using a fertilizer that will give him the best results. The fertilizer should be applied in the form of a top-dressing, and the soil should be worked to a depth of 4 to 6 inches.
