Prohibition Amendment. The Prohibition Amendment is a permanent part of our State Constitution which the people of Kentucky voted to repeat in 1901.

National Repeat still left Kentucky with prohibition laws which, under the Federal Constitution, could not be repealed until the November election of 1935.

When that date, the Legislature in 1934 passed an act known as the Liquor Control Act, which now permits an emergency measure the sale of alcoholic beverages.
