Lamb Losses Heaviest in History of State

Of 600,000 lambs, or nearly 10 percent of all born to date, the loss of one of the worst winter seasons in the history of the animal husbandry department of the University of Kentucky has been reported.

In addition to losses among the lambs, the University has reported a heavy loss of ewes, many of which were not in good condition at the time of lambing. Some of the factors responsible for losses at lambing time, and possible ways whereby such losses might be reduced, in part, are:

"I have equipped lambing quads with extra feed, and have had extra feed for ewes during the winter. I do not advocate extra feed for a lamb under 2 years of age, but I believe that most Kentucky sheep men must depend upon extra feed for lambing sheds. The average producer here could be made very comfortable at little cost.
