many children. It often comes on with only slight symptoms such as a sore throat. A little fever or aching pains and it may be mistaken for tonsillitis or laryngitis or some other less serious illness. Yet, when symptoms are slight there is great danger.

During the last five years, Nicholas County has had 34 cases of diphtheria. The most awful part of this fact is that all could have been prevented by modern means of education. Diphtheria could be wiped out. Deaths which occur and have occurred due to this disease in this county can be prevented.

At present only 41.8 per cent of the children under ten years of age in the county are immunized against diphtheria. Have yours!

Order of County Judge for
Local Option Election

STATE OF KENTUCKY
NICHOLAS COUNTY COURT,
Regular Term, Nicholas County, held August 10, 1942, Hon. Walter Shepherd, Judge, Presiding.
IN RE: Dr. G. T. Cowan, et al. ON PETITION.
WHEREAS, There has been filed with the County Clerk of Nicholas County a petition signed by Dr. G. T. Cowan and others, requesting this Court to enter an order directing that an election be held in Nicholas County, Kentucky, on October 3, 1942, for the purpose of taking the sense of the legal voters of said county upon the proposition as to whether or not spirituous, vinous or malt liquors shall be sold, bartered or loaned therein; and

WHEREAS, It further appearing to the Court that the number of signers, totaling 424, to said petition is equal to twenty-five per cent of the voters cast in said election at the last preceding general election and that said signers bear the date of signing and the postoffice address of said petitioners. Therefore

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED That an election be held in Nicholas County, Kentucky, for the purpose of taking the sense of the legal voters of said county upon the proposition of whether or not spirituous, vinous or malt liquors shall be sold, bartered, or loaned therein, said election to be held on the 3rd day of October, 1942.

The proposition to be voted upon shall be stated on the ballot without emblems and two spaces left upon the right side of same, one for votes favoring the proposition to be designated by the word "YES" and one for votes opposing it, designated by the word "NO."

The Question to be submitted shall be in words and figures as follows:
"ARE YOU IN FAVOR OF ADOPTING THE LOCAL OPTION LAW IN NICHOLAS COUNTY, KENTUCKY?"

The County Court Clerk shall within five days (5) from the entering of this order, give to the Sheriff of Nicholas County, Kentucky, a certified copy of this order. It shall be the duty of the Sheriff to have same circulated in the Carlisle Mercury, a newspaper of general circulation published in Nicholas County, for at least two weeks (14 days) before the election, and also to advertise same by written or printed handbills posted at not less than five (5) conspicuous places in each of said precincts for at least two weeks (14 days) before said election.

The said election, including the canvass and counting of the ballots, shall be held in accordance with the provisions of the general election laws of the State, and the duties of all officers pertaining thereto shall devolve upon and shall be performed by each of them in relation to said election the same as in general elections, except the same may be modified by or inconsistent with Kentucky Statutes, Sections 2554-4 to 2554-6-2, inclusive, some being Chapter 1 of the Acts of the General Assembly, regular session, enacted in 1936, and approved Feb. 25, 1936.

The County Court Clerk will also send a certified copy of this order to the Election Commissioners of Nicholas County.

Credit will be given on the basis of the weight of the scrap metal. The county clerk will be credited with the weight of the scrap metal. No credit will be given for scrap metal which is not weighed on a certified scale. Every individual living in the state and not engaged in the business of collecting scrap metal, is eligible to compete for the prize in his own county.

Every State Judge Organization (in existence) at Carlisle, Ky. Branches: P.A.A., Club, Girl Scouts or Camp Fire Girls, is eligible to compete for "boy" and "girl" prizes.
