Banks Elect Officers, Only One Major Change

Robert T. Fisher Becomes President of Farmers Bank

With but one major change, Carlisle's three banks Tuesday afternoon elected officers and directors for the coming year. The change was in the presidency of the Farmers Bank, where Robert T. Fisher, Carlisle merchant, succeeded Bruce McLeod, who is now a lieutenant in the United States Army. All other officers and directors were re-elected.

At the First National Bank, T. Letton was re-elected president, Henry L. Carter, vice president, A. Palmer, assistant cashier, Mrs. M. L. Letton, bookkeeper, Mr. Letton, Mrs. Isabel P. King, Mrs. Anna K. Harkness, Dr. H. B. Reynolds and Mr. Carter, directors. The Farmers Bank now has Mr. Fisher as president, Judge Walter Washburn, vice president, Henry Kennedy, cashier, Ruth K. Lambert, assistant cashier, and John P. Ross, bookkeeper. Directors are Mr. Fisher, Mr. Washburn, Mr. Kennedy, Mrs. Lambert, and Mrs. Laine Kennedy.
