**TOBACCO PRICES VARY**  
**LITTLE ON MARKETS**  
That tobacco crop is well on its way to a new market as an industry, quality considered, is set out in a new bulletin of the Kentucky Agricultural Experiment Station, dated "Prices of Tobacco on Eastern Markets in Kentucky".

All markets pay relatively the same price for the same grade of leaf. A detailed study of price variations in its market areas, made at the height of the recent season, showed an consistent upward trend of one cent over another for a year of life quality and grade.

Each market area had some grades which at times averaged higher in price, than in other areas, and some other grades which averaged lower in price, but less than 10 per cent of the grades varied between areas enough to show any real difference in price.

**600 Acres Fall Broom**  
In Leslie county, where the growing of fall broom is an annual task crop farmers need have approximately 600 acres under cultivation, where no spray or dust control can be used, that the experiment station has six acres reported to be infested with broom.

**Printing Adds To Tobacco Yield**  
Farm Agent Charles E. Cabhead of Wolfe county estimates that more than 150 farmers have printed their tobacco this year for the first time. Results have been very satisfactory.

**Carlisle Farmer Makes Top Yield**
