FATAL SHOOTING NEAR BLUE LICKS TAKES TWO LIVES

A double tragedy occurred in Nicholas county Friday night when Martin Sampson, 34, and killed his 22-year-old father, George Sampson, and then turned the gun on himself, inflicting head wounds from which he died early Saturday at the Good Samaritan hospital in Lexington.

The shooting first reported to have taken place near the home of the two farmers at Blue Lick Springs. The father was killed instantly and the son taken to the Lexington hospital, died at 12:30 p. m. from wounds inflicted when he fired the shotgun into his mouth.

George Sampson is survived by his wife, Mrs. Ida Sugg Sampson, and a brother, Ed Sampson, who also reside in Nicholas county. Martin Sampson is survived by his mother, Mrs. M. Mrs. Sue Allison Sampson, and his son, Danny, Nicholas county. The bodies were removed to Matthews-Patterson funeral home for double funeral service held at the family lot in the Carlsle cemetery at 2 p. m. Monday afternoon, with Rev. M. T. Yoder, former pastor of the North Macedonia Christian church officiating. Masonic rites for George Sampson were conducted at the grave by Harvey C. Nutter, of the Carlsle lodge, F. and A. M.
