MISSOURI EDITOR DISCOVERS
TV's So-Called "Benefits" Are Costly And Over-Rated
The following article is condensed from the St. Louis Globe-Democrat, an issue of the Missouri Valley by a party of Missourians investigating the feasibility of applying the TVA to the Missouri Valley.

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To the Citizens of Nicholas County:

In Judge Shepherd's opening statement in announcing for County Judge he used considerable space in dealing with the fiscal affairs of the County and about his claim for having saved approximately \$5,868 per year during his term of office or a total of \$23,664 for the four years.

He failed to tell you however, that the Budget was overdrawn and in the RED this year for the first time in several years.

He also failed to tell you that the State of Kentucky during 1944 and 1945 contributed \$145,456 in materials and supplies to this county, or more in two years than his so-called "savings" for the entire four years of his term.

This so-called "savings" in two years, contributed by you as taxpayers to the road and bridge fund and for which you are receiving no benefit whatsoever.

This "savings" would go a long way toward repairing some of our roads, which are in a most deplorable condition. Roads in this county that during the mid 1940's have been forced to suspend operation, thus forcing farmers to go out on business or haul their milk and other products to some other way. For the convenience of the county, I refer you to some of the good points of the East Union vicinity.
