WHY K. U. USES STEAM

Originally, in 1922, it took eight pounds of coal to produce a kilowatt-hour of electricity by steam. At that time water power cost about 10¢ per kilowatt-hour. By 1925, steam power took only about three pounds of coal.

By 1925, it had dropped to 4 pounds, and today a new plant can develop a kilowatt-hour with only one pound of coal. In that scaling down, steam power paid water power, and it now much cheaper. The cost of steam power is made up very largely of the cost of coal and labor.

On the other hand, practically 80 per cent of the cost of water power is in the cost of the income taxes on the investment in dams and the land-also land. Generally speaking, the first cost of water power is from three to five times the first cost of steam power.

Last year from Kentucky mines we brought and used 477,248 tons of coal, producing some 91,800 man-days of work for coal miners, and thousands of work days for transportation employees. Only one man on each shift are required to control the boiler in a modern plant like Tipton. These men are an important fraction of the 1114 employees who last year were paid nearly \$19,840,000 in wages and salaries. About 200 tons of each dollar of K.U.'s income last year went directly to plant employees in wages. Another 162 1/2 cents of each income dollar went to the cost of education, of roads, and other government expense. K.U.'s total tax bill for these purposes was \$13,143,771.
