The burley tobacco market in Kentucky opened Monday with an average of \$18.25 per hundred pounds. This was approximately \$4 lower than the average last year.

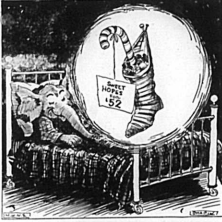
