The tax books are in the office of the tax commissioner in the county court house and may be inspected between the hours of 8:00 a. m. and 4:00 p. m.

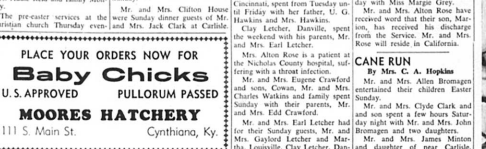
