The introduction of flour into the city water system, a process commonly called "flouridation," may reduce dental decay in children as much as 66 percent if the flour-treated water is used through the first eight years of their life. This benefit, once obtained, is thought to endure for life. The city council in their regular session Monday night adopted an ordinance to put the flour water system under the "flouridation" process in order to help prevent dental decay. Because the city which will have the flour-treated water is now up to the date of the flouridation process, the city water system under "flouridation" can begin. Besides the benefits to children, flouridated water also helps prevent decay in adult teeth, although it is not as effective. The cost of installing a "flouridation" plant for a water system comparable to that of Carlisle is estimated to be around \$500,000. Medical associations control this type of flouridated water by residents of the city in dental bills will more than pay for the original investment in the subsequent operation. The Mercury believes that "flouridation" of the Carlisle water system will be a great benefit to the city and believe that the city should be adding means for the flouridation of the water supply service for its residents.
