### Cooperation Works

A few days after our 177th anniversary of independence, Canada also celebrated the anniversary of her founding as a self-governing nation.

There is a pleasant symbolism in the fact that two of our neighbors came on almost identical days. For as nations on earth have shown, over the years, greater friendliness, solidarity and mutual respect than exists between Canada and the United States.

The two governments have worked amicably together in solving common problems in peace and war. And as have major enterprises within the United States, being vast land areas, are greatly dependent on rail transportation. And railroads of both nations work together through mutual aid and cooperative agencies, making possible a continuous flow of materials through the industrial products of their factories—and to the benefit of our country.

Under such conditions, the workers get on at the best. Just as in our land, Canada's fine labor and private enterprise will be a great help.

### Fictional Estimates

Government agencies often get Congressional approval for projects and the spent estimates of cost which afterwards prove to be noticeably in excess of the original estimates.

Does that mean that the two strong statements that the government agencies are making are a constant underflow of the actual cost? It is not so. The House committee which investigated the Corps of Engineers' Civil Works Program in 1951. The cost of the river-and-harbor and flood control projects under construction by the Corps of Engineers in fiscal year 1951, had increased an estimated 10 percent over the original estimate for these 182 projects when they were authorized by Congress and the spent amounts submitted in connection with the budget for fiscal year 1951. The total cost of the program was \$1.2 billion, an increase of 10 percent over the original estimate.

Keep that in mind the next time you hear politicians bragging about the cost of their projects. They may be making more than one estimate.
