Chart The Road

A recent Saturday Evening Post editorial begins, "Of the 1,117 bills and resolutions drafted last year by the House of Representatives on the opening day of the 73rd Congress, only 100 have been passed. The remainder, identified as House Resolution 12,"

That resolution, introduced by Rep. Candler of New York, authorizes the House to conduct an inquiry and recommend to Congress ways and means by which commercial business now owned and operated by the government can be sold to private citizens, corporations, or corporations.

Going on, the Post said, "Some weeks before the election, Charles E. Wilson—the former Director of the Federal Reserve Bank—told the country that the possibility of selling our national debts, generating electricity and distribution facilities to the people, Mr. Wilson suggested that the switch-over could be completed simply by authorizing holders of government obligations to exchange their bonds for stock in TVA, or what have you.

"This is a tempting idea," Mr. Wilson estimates the value of government-owned businesses at about \$175,000,000. If they were sold, three things would happen. First, the debt itself would be reduced. Second, interest payments on this much of the debt, some \$50,000,000 per year, would no longer be paid. And third, these properties would yield taxes for federal and local government.

"The whole idea of decentralizing is likely to become popular. In any event, there is nothing wrong with Mr. Candler's proposal to make a study of the whole matter. The road way from socialism must be charted or it will never be completed."

Edwin Dickinson is now being given to the problem of debt reduction and tax reduction. How could a better case be made than by joining the government out of debt-reducing, tax-cutting, and other measures?
