Recipe Of The Week

Apple Crisp With Present Brittle
4 sliced apples
1 cinnamon
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup butter or margarine
1/2 cup crushed pecans
1/2 cup water
Place sliced apples in buttered baking dish. Mix cinnamon with 1/2 cup of sugar sprinkle over the apples. Dot with butter. Mix the remaining sugar, flour and cream peanut brittle and spread over the fruit mixture. Sprinkle with pecans and bake in a moderate oven, 350-375 degrees, for about 45 minutes, or until apples are done and top layer is dry. Serve hot or cold with cream.
