out. Three Yellow Perennials were bought between 1795 and 1796 over disputed land claims and were settled. There were other areas. Tracts were set up by the land company that brought perennials to the state. The present State of Louisiana was formed from the Territory of Orleans, whose name was changed to that of a city. By a French charter, New Orleans would have been named Acadia. New York and New Jersey were part of New Netherlands of the Dutch. Settlers along the lower Delaware River established New Sweden long before William Penn's colonies arrived. His name would be used by New World grant merely symbolically.
