### Good News for the Communists

If a survey made by the Opinion Research Corporation among voters in 16 High School districts in the county, it reveals that there is something alarming wrong with American education.

According to the results, 52 per cent of the voters do not believe we have competition in the home; 60 per cent feel we will not be able to stand up to the competition of the foreign; 57 per cent are sure the Communist doctrine of "iron shutters" will be able to keep us from getting a majority; and 46 per cent think a worker should not produce all he is capable of.

Opponents of the change, on the other hand, think that the present system provides a better education than that which is being given by the Communists.
