Interstate Park
First Of Kind
In Nation

History is being made in the development of the 1000-acre Interstate Park near Elkhorn City, Ky., by the state Commonwealth. Numerous waterfalls are featured as the river takes its southward course through the hazy-red river.

For about as long as the oldest tradition being in the neighborhood of the Breaks can remember there has been a tradition, for some years of a park to take advantage of the scenic wonder. But only in recent years has anything concrete been done about it.

Back in the fall of 1949 a concrete plan was sponsored by the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the State Chamber of Commerce visited the site and E. C. Clements, then governor, laid out a plan which he believed would build a practically inaccessible from the Kentucky river.
