MAN ON THE STREET

Democrats would control congress if election were held today

Princeton, New Jersey—If the nationwide Congressional elections were held today, Congress, the House of Representatives would very likely go Democratic.

Here's the way MAN ON THE STREET sees it at this time:

Democrats 52%
Republicans 48%

In 1952, the Republicans won control of the House of Representatives by a margin of 3 seats at the same time receiving only 48.8 per cent of the active vote. And in the 1954 nationwide Congressional Elections, the Democrats won control of Congress, House of Representatives by a margin of about 20 per cent. The 1954 effort was approved that the Democrats took 52.8 per cent of the Congressional vote, the Republicans, 47.2 per cent.

When today's Congressional vote is stacked up alongside the national Congressional vote in the past six Presidential election years, the trend looks like this:

From the above table, it can be seen that in the past six Presidential election years, the Democrats have always won control of the House of Representatives, albeit not the actual number of Congressional seats.

At a representative election, the GOP was defeated in 1952. It is one of the above table also shows that GOP Congressional candidates lost 28 per cent more today as they did in 1952—48 per cent today as they did in the November, 1952, elections.

But another interesting sidelight in today's findings is the fact that at the present time, President Eisenhower is running 41 per cent ahead of the GOP Congressional candidate list.

Last week's MAN ON THE STREET election showed Eisenhower with 62 per cent of the vote to Stevenson's 38 per cent. Today's vote, GOP Congressional candidates, only 48 per cent to the Democrats, 52%.
