If you're in business, there's a good thing Uncle Sam is one of your competitors. And if you're not in business, you will want help to get through your taxes for the government's business-type activities.

That observation comes from the Chamber of Commerce of the United States. It is solidly backed up by a set of facts.

According to the Bureau of the Budget, the government actually is spending \$7.72 billion on commercial industrial undertakings, with 266 thousand employees and close to \$12 billion of capital assets. These fall into more than 200 categories, including mining, manufacturing, wholesales and retail trade, farming, transportation, communication, services such as electric power, insurance, and so on and so on.

The Chamber also points out that where Uncle Sam runs a business that private citizens could run just as well, it is not necessary to the cost of government. Further, he is being revenue for private busi-
