Bill Clinger of Peebles, Ohio, took over management of the Kroger store in Carlisle, Ohio, on Monday, June 8.

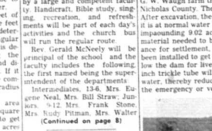
School Board must pay for services

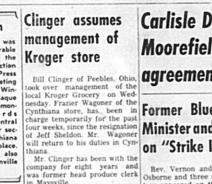

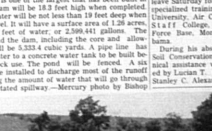
