Demand Grows For Budget Cutting

Postal savings halted over the weekend, but judging from news accounts the mailbags were back on the job Monday morning, en route to Washington in favor of reducing government spending.

"Being mail bags crammed with calls from the folks back home to cut that budget" is being made into a Congressional effort," writes Douglas H. Correll of the Associated Press. Some of the writers—as is to be expected—made the economy more or less immune to projects in which they aren't personally involved. 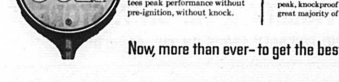
