THE FFA CREED

Approved by the National FFA Convention, 1935

"I believe in the future of farming, with a faith born not of words, but of deeds—achievements won by the present and past generations. I believe in the promise of a better life through better ways, and in the better things we may have come up to as the struggles of former years.

"I believe that to live and work on a good farm is pleasant as well as challenging, for I know the joys and discomforts of farm life and hold of laborers fondness for those associations which, even in hours of discouragement, I cannot deny.

"I believe in leadership from ourselves and respect from others. I believe in the value of knowledge and skill, and in the ability of organized farmers to serve the public and to make their own destinies in the product of our soil. I believe we can save those rights against practices and policies that are unfair.

"I believe in self-dependence on begging and more power in handicrafting. In the life abundant and enough honest wealth to help make it so for others, as well as myself, in less need for charity and more of it for the needy, and in the ability of the individual to square up with those whose happiness depends on his own.

"I believe that rural America can and will hold true to the best traditions in our national life and that I can exert an influence in my home and community which will stand solid for my part in that inspiring task.
