

**Recipe of the week**  
There's an old superstition that you will have good luck throughout the coming year if you eat black-eye peas and pork on New Year's Day. So that as a busy, it is a dish to enjoy when prepared according to the following recipe:  
Fry one or dried black-eye peas may be used, but the latter should be soaked over night.  
1 ham hock with black-eye peas  
1 ham hock  
1 ham scrape  
1 qt. water

**3 c frozen black-eye peas**  
2 medium onions  
Dash of cayenne  
Salted as needed  
black pepper  
In a heavy kettle with a tight lid place the ham hock, ham scrape and water. Let simmer about 1 hour, adding more water if necessary. Add chopped onion, black-eye peas and ham scrapings and continue cooking for 20 minutes. If soaked dried peas are used, cook for 40 minutes, or until tender.  
Meat: Ham hock with black-eye peas, buttered cabbage, fried salad, cornbread, hotter and apple cobbler with cream.

Christmas bread is traditional with many families on Christmas morning. In this recipe, an apricot filling is made and rolled in the bread, much as a cinnamon roll is made, says Mrs. Pearl Hask, Extension Foods Specialist at the University of Kentucky.

**Filled Christmas Bread (Three loaves)**  
2 pkgs or cakes of yeast  
1 c lukewarm water  
1 c scalded milk  
1/2 c butter  
1/2 c sugar  
1 T salt  
1/2 c cold water  
3/4 to 1 c sifted flour  
2 eggs beaten  
1/4 t ground cardamom  
1 c cornmeal

Soften yeast in lukewarm water. Four scalded milk over butter, sugar and salt. Stir as casually. Add cold water and yeast mixture to lukewarm. Stir in 2 cups of flour and beaten eggs. Add softened yeast, corn meal and cardamom. Add flour to make a soft dough.  
Turn dough on floured board. Knead until sticky about 10 minutes. Round into ball shape and brush lightly with melted shortening. Cover and let rise until double in bulk, about 1 hour. Punch down, divide into three portions, cover and let rest about 10 minutes.  
Roll each portion to form rectangle about 8 by 15 inches. Spread each with apricot filling, roll to form a loaf and place in greased bread pan. Brush with melted shortening, cover and let rise until almost double in bulk, about 45 minutes. Bake in moderate oven, 375 degrees, for 45 to 60 minutes, or until bread is brown and begins to pull away from pan.  
Apricot Filling: Simmer cups dried apricots in 2 cups water until tender. Drain, press through a sieve. To the pulp, add 1/2 cup sugar, 1 cup chopped pecans, 1/2 cup honey and grated rind of 1 orange, mixing well.  
Meat for Christmas breakfast: Grapefruit garnished with red cherry, sausage and scrambled eggs, filled bread, butter and coffee.
