May enforce dog quarantine health, livestock officials say as rabies cases spread

All dogs in Nicholas County may be subject to a quarantine if the rabies situation does not improve. It was learned this week the outbreak of rabies began a little over a month ago when a cow belonging to James Gaunce of the Bartlettville road died from rabies. At that time it was reported that several other head of livestock in the County had died from unknown causes.

Dr. E. P. Reynolds, Nicholas County Health Department head and Dr. W. G. Irwin, Nicholas County Livestock Inspector, announced to the press Monday that it may be necessary to place all dogs under a quarantine while an attempt is made to determine what animal or animals are the carrier of this disease.
