The Kentucky Municipal League has raised a howl about the recent model publication law passed in the last session of the legislature. The bill was supported by the Kentucky Press Association as a public information measure. It is the taxpayers' right to know how his funds are being handled and what action is being taken by the various branches of government.

In fact, the new law is merely codification of existing statutes with a few additions that put teeth into law. There now is no doubt the person responsible for making legal publication to the public may know it as designated in the bill. The secretary of the Municipal League has described the bill as a money getting measure for the newspapers. This is far from the truth. It is a public information bill. The bill was designed to let the people know what is going on in government and to prevent public officials from coming up and keeping financial reports from the people.

If a person wanted to be real harsh he could say the bill was designed to let public officials from being tempted to take public funds, or to take official action without the public interest.
