Communism borrows from capitalism

The totalitarian countries are always critical of what is often termed the "dividend capitalism" of the United States. But, on occasion, they will borrow American ideas and techniques with enthusiasm.

Last September a Grand Fair was held in Zagreb, Yugoslavia. One of the exhibits, made possible by cooperation between government and private enterprise, was a U. S. style supermarket. It was the kind of market that Americans take for granted, but it was so new and marvelous as to attract the people of Yugoslavia. More than a million people viewed the display, and it was a smash hit by any standard.

After the fair closed, the market was sold to the Yugoslav government. It was to be a "Vrazar." This spring it will be opened for business in Belgrade. Yugoslavia's capital, and will be the first self-service store in that city. An American store executive will be there to supervise its setting up, equipping and working.

This is a symbol of the superiority of American retailing to that of the vast majority of other nations. What is true of this super-market is true of department stores, variety stores, and other American retail outlets. People are not the same, but just have been so much influenced by Americans. When foreigners come to this country for the first time, they are amazed at the variety of goods offered in our stores—and by the fact that most of these goods are within their grasp.
