The ostrich is a funny bird. When he wants to avoid a problem, he sticks his head in the sand and pretends it doesn't exist. He isn't fooling anybody but himself, for the problem is there - whether he looks at it or not.

That's how it is with the alcohol beverage problem. You can look at it squarely and admit the truth; that liquor is being sold in "dry" Carlisle, today; that it has always been sold and always will be. Or, like the ostrich, you can stick your head in the sand and refuse to face facts.

Thinking people know that the real question to be decided on next Saturday, is not whether alcohol beverages shall be sold in Carlisle, but HOW they are sold—LEGALLY or ILLEGALLY. That's the only question.

Under the present so-called dry system, bootleggers are getting rich while Carlisle is losing tax revenue for public services, and our merchants are losing trade dollars to nearby legal sale communities.

Advocates of Legal Control are not necessarily "wet" or "dry." They are interested in the welfare and future of Carlisle. They know that "Prohibition" cannot be enforced here when liquor can be bought legally on either side of us, in Harrison, Bourbon, and Mason Counties, and from the numerous bootleggers in our midst.

**Here's How The New Control Plan Works:**

1. Sales by qualified licensees in City limits of Carlisle carefully selected by State, County and City Authorities.
2. No sales to minors. No Sunday sales. Package liquor sales only.
3. Better law enforcement.
4. Much needed revenue to our City and increased trade dollars to our merchants.

Isn't that better than the present "Prohibition" system of bootleg sales to anybody, anywhere, anytime—with all the profits going to the bootleggers?

Let's take our heads out of the sand! Let's drive the bootleggers out of Carlisle! Turn the "YES" lever on Saturday, September 27th.
