Winter causes many problems
Before winter's bitter weather sets in, check a few of our mechanical devices to insure operation and safety. Buy Ear-Mills, UK Cooperative Reclamation Service engineer.
Winterize your tractor. Buy competent service man can tell you how to do it. This will save many hours struggling to snow or ice.
Get farm equipment indoors—preferably in a garage or barn, or at least in an open-front shed. This will keep snow and ice from moving parts, and lengthen the life of the equipment.
Check electric tank batteries to make sure they are well grounded. Make sure fuel tank leaders are in good repair. Insulate water pipes to keep them from freezing. If pipes do freeze, they must be unthawed in one direction and thawing with blow torches, fans, etc., increase the fire hazard.
When roads are snowy or icy, check speed, wipers, etc.
