- (1) All state, County and District Taxes for the year 1959 are due and payable on September 15, 1959.
- (2) All of said taxes can be paid until January 1, 1960 with no penalty.
- (3) All of said taxes paid after January 1, 1960, shall be subject to a 2% penalty during the month of January and 6% thereafter.
