## Nicholas County loses R.E.A. project; Alois Peters chosen Carlisle mayor

Failure of Nicholas County to cooperate fully and to execute necessary policy duty in France, near P. Davis, District Supervisor, caused the loss of the proposed rural electric project, according to the local board of directors. The project was approved by the R.E.A. board in 1957, but was not completed because of the county's failure to provide the necessary funds. The project would have provided electricity to the county's farms and homes. The R.E.A. board has now decided to award the project to Alois Peters, who was chosen as the new Carlisle mayor. Peters was elected to the office on January 5, 1959. He will take office on January 13, 1959. Peters is a well-known farmer and businessman in the Carlisle area. He has served in the Nicholas County Board of Directors for several years. He is also a member of the Carlisle Community Center and the Carlisle Fire Department. Peters was born in 1905 and has a wife and three children. He is a member of the Carlisle Baptist Church. Peters was elected to the office of mayor by a vote of 100 to 0. He will be the first mayor of Carlisle to be elected to the office. Peters will be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the city.
