**Wheat quota vote date set**  
As required by previous law, a wheat marketing quota referendum has been announced for July 23, Chairman Roy C. Gray of the Kentucky Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Commission announced today.  
Marketing quotas for the 1959 wheat crop have been proclaimed by the Secretary of Agriculture as required by legislation whenever the available supply exceeds a certain amount. However, quotas will not become effective unless they are approved by at least two-thirds of the producers voting in the referendum.  
If quotas are approved for the 1959 wheat crop, it will mark the seventh consecutive year they have been used for wheat. Wheat quotas and acreage adjustments apply only to the 39 so-called "commercial" wheat states, of which Kentucky is one.  
The present law, the Chairman explained, states that if the quota is not in the referendum, a grower must expect to have more than 15 bushels of wheat for harvest at grain in 1959, and must grower who signs an application under the wheat quota provision permit.
