## Destroying the dollar

The fiscal situation deteriorated faster during the past year than in any comparable previous period in our history. That grim statement came from one of the top Congressional authorities on government finance and taxation—Senator Fred A. Vandergriff.

The Senator defined up what has been going on, and it would be hard to find a darker picture. Deficit financing has been the rule rather than the exception for more than a quarter of a century. In January of this year the federal debt was at all-time high, exceeding the World War I peak by more than \$6 billion. We have reached a point of serious relations to avoid, and the bonds of the U. S. government. Circulation has reduced the purchasing power of our money by 25% since 1929.

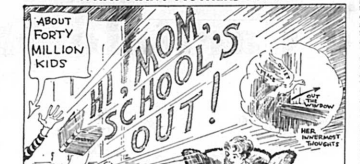
## Heat wave continues, rain needed; block of ice mashes man's toe
