Device reads handwritten words

A small device that reads handwritten words has been built at Bell Telephone Laboratories. It has a ten-word vocabulary—'one' through 'ten'—printed out. The handwriting reader, about the size of a briefcase, was invented by demonstrating the use of ink on a piece of paper. The device is built to read a wide variety of handwriting styles. 'Reading machine' could be valuable in any business or industry where information must be translated into adding machine or punched cards, by tape, and by pressing the name, spelled out, in the Bell System, reading machine would help in translating long toll tickets, in processing bill books and orders for change in service, and in other commercial applications. The handwriting reader is an experimental step in the study of how such machines can be made.

Wild turkey hunt season April 27-29

Frankfort, Ky., Feb. 25.—The first wild turkey hunting season in modern times will be held in Kentucky on April 27, 28 and 29 this year on units 50 turkey pickers are killed on a designated tract in the Kentucky Woodlands. Max V. Wolf, Wildlife Refuge has just announced. The hunt is made possible through the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife which operates the units as a baited, no-expense or free permitted; hunters must check in and out of the refuge; hunting will be permitted only with only 200 hunters per unit each day, with "first come, first served" basis. Also a valid State hunting license must be held by the hunter. According to the rules, applicants for permits will be received by mail or in person at the designated tract in the Kentucky Woodlands, Route 2, Golden, Ky.
