Watts urges enactment of barley price stabilization bill
Congressman John C. Watts from Kentucky's Sixth Congressional District—the heart of the barley tobacco belt—today introduced a bill which would stabilize barley tobacco support prices and insure that farmers receive a fair return on their crops.

Watts said that the bill would stabilize support prices for barley at 10 cents a bushel and for tobacco at 10 cents a pound. He said that the bill would also provide for a 10 percent increase in the support price for barley if the price of the crop falls below 10 cents a bushel.
