"Wisdom is better than strength"
These words from Ecclesiastes are more than 2,000 years old but they have special meaning for us today. We face the challenge of unprecedented crises around and the challenge of unprecedented growth in the power of our country and of our own power, as brain power.
Our country has surpassed great eras in the past. Not because of our wealth, not because of our resources, not because of our technology, not because of our bigger television screens than anyone else, but because our ideas were more compelling and more penetrating and more wise and enduring.
Today we need both wisdom and strength

and that's the reason why Americans should "Wake Up and Breathe!" For while we are concentrating our attention on reinforcing every weapon in our arsenal of military strength, let's not neglect one of the great "arsenals" of wisdom: the public library.
This country pioneered in the development of library facilities. But we are no longer first on our laurels. National Library Week gives us an opportunity to spotlight the successful programs.
Eighty million people in the United States have inadequate library service. Twenty-five and a half million have no public library service at all. Eleven million children have no access to school libraries.
If this nation, in its role as wise as well as strong, if we are to live up to our national promise and to our national destiny, then we need more ideas for more "wise" reading and more good books in more public libraries.
