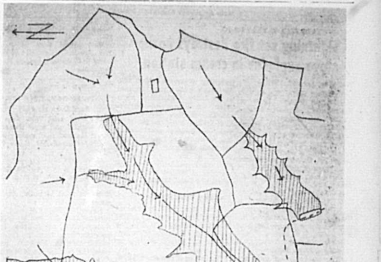

NICHOLAS COUNTY LAKE RESORT
Owned by Nicholas County Development Corporation, a nonprofit organization created to develop recreation, utility, industrial, and other improvements during 1961 the Nicholas County Lake will be constructed by Small's Greenhouse, a Kentucky Highway Department project. The lake will be 125 to 140 acres in area with a shore line of 29,000 feet. Capacity will be four and one-half billion gallons of water and tons of boats, including 100 motor boats.
