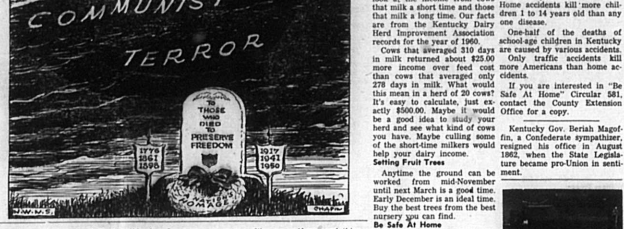

How Many Days
Do You Give Milk?
The number of days a cow milks during a lactation period is important to a farmer's pocketbook. Some dairy cows don't milk as many days as they should and the sad part is that in some herds nearly all cows are of this kind. Let's take a look at the income from all cows that milk a short time and those that milk a long time. Our facts are from the Kentucky Dairy Herd Improvement Association records for the year of 1960. Cows that averaged 219 days in milk returned about \$25.00 more income over feed cost than cows that averaged only 278 days in milk. What would this mean in a herd of 20 cows? It's easy to calculate. Just multiply the number of days that a cow milks by the price of milk per cwt. For example, if a cow milks 278 days at \$10.00 per cwt., she will produce \$2,780.00 worth of milk. If she milks 219 days at \$10.00 per cwt., she will produce \$2,190.00 worth of milk. The difference is \$590.00. This is the difference in income between a cow that milks 278 days and a cow that milks 219 days. This is the difference between a cow that milks a long time and a cow that milks a short time.
