


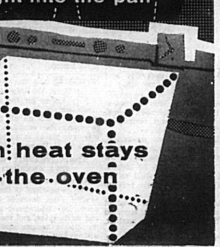

(Continued from page 6) Mason and his three secretaries, were taken prisoner. Their protesting wives stayed in leaving, told his wife, "Good-bye, my dear, we shall meet in Paris in sixty days." His teenage daughter wept as he was taken away.

Repatriations were immediate. When the Trent reached England, the crewmen were treated as heroes, and a cry went up in the press for redress from the Yankees for the insult to British rights. The government ordered 6,000 crack troops to Canada, and war seemed imminent.

In the United States, the picture was reversed. Wilkes held for him in Boston and New York. The House of Representatives gave him a vote of thanks for his bold maneuver. Crowds cheered him, and Mason and Sidel were imprisoned at Coles Island, New York.

In the South, the seizure was on every tongue, and President Jefferson Davis was indignant. At the same time, he and others thought gloriously of the prospect of Britain's declaring war against the United States. Britain protested formally, and an assurance came from Washington that Wilkes had acted on his own, not on order of his government. Then France, Prussia and Austria tannant in Cynthiana. 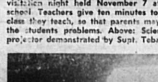
