Can pasture diverted acres

R. O. Wilson, Chairman of the Kentucky ASC Committee, has announced that farmers are now authorized to pasture their 1961 Feed Grain Program Diverted Acres. The authorization became effective November 18, 1961. Wilson said the authorization was granted to allow livestock to get to water supplies and to allow livestock to range over diverted acres to pasture adjoining creek fields, however; when the authorization was granted, it was decided that all diverted acres would be eligible for pasturing. Farmers are still restricted from harvesting any crop from the diverted acres until after their 1961 Feed Grain Program Contract expires which is December 31, 1961.
