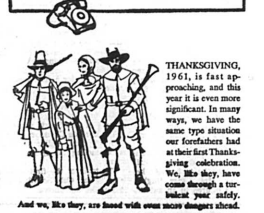

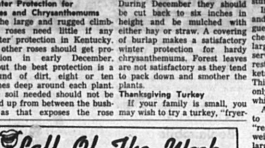

on a haphazard basis, collecting papers of Kentucky labor unions. Now he is looking for all types of historical material. These materials are used in the Library regularly by approved scholars, under the supervision of the Archives Department.

Finch explained that although the Library prefers outgoing gifts, material may either be deposited there or loaned to the Library to be copied by microfilm.

Materials loaned for this purpose are inventoried by Finch before he leaves the home or office where he picks them up. A duplicate copy of this inventory is left with the owner of the items and the materials are returned within a short time.

Restrictions may be placed on material, such as confidential items which can not be used for a certain period of years or only on approval of the family. Finch said some business and unions have placed this approval restriction so that material can not be misused.

Finch also makes arrangements with county officials for the filming of county records which is done by the Genealogical Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. Copies of these films
